and walk with joy, gratitude and trust into the new world.






Al's Academy

Nominating: Larry Neuhardt/Dinah Haag - the proposed Slate of Officers include: 1) Ann Osborn and Andy Mollema will continue as Clerk and Treasurer respectively; 2) Andrea Frost, Mary Ann Harness and Bill Hirschfeld have agreed to continue for 3-year terms; 3) Kelly Ottinger agreed to be Assistant Treasurer; 4) Denis Crosby will be contacted and asked to fill a new 3-year term as an atlarge member; and 5) Nora Bungard will be contacted and asked to fill the job of Assistant Financial Secretary.

<u>Property</u>: Mary Reed - no report, but the altar railing has been completed and the roof area above Katherine's office damaged by the recent high winds has been repaired.

<u>Religious Education</u>: Bill Hirschfeld - 1) Sunday School is running along smoothly; 2) the children's Christmas Pageant will be held December 17; and 3) Bill is asking for any ideas for Bible Studies that will begin after the first of the year.

<u>Women's Fellowship</u>: Mary Reed - the monies made from the Silver Tea totaled approximately \$1,038.00.

Pastor's Report: Dinah Haag - report submitted **Unfinished Business**: Operation Care update: Kelly Ottinger reported that five people have responded to the first announcement; in January there will be another call for people who are interested in helping. New Business: 1) 2018 Budget: following discussion and a few changes to be implemented, the motion was made by Myra Elias that Council approve the recommended 2018 Budget; Mary Reed seconded. Motion passed. 2) Investment Committee's recommendation: the motion was made by Bill Hirschfeld that Council approve the 10% withdrawal from the Investment Fund to help with the Church budget; Judy Grant seconded. Motion passed. 3) Andy Mollema asked that Council approve the Investment Funds withdrawal monies to be put into the Brawner Account for simplification in his Treasurer's job; Judy Welch made the motion that Council approve the above request; Mary Ann Harness seconded motion. Motion passed. 4) Staff Bonuses: the motion was made by Bill Hirschfeld that the year- end bonuses for our staff remain the same with the addition of a \$150.00 bonus for Brooke Trentham, our bookkeeper; Judy Grant seconded the motion. Motion passed. 6) Discussion on what kind of thank you gift could be given to Pete Wright, who built the Time Capsule and the altar railing and asked for no payment; Leslie McElduff made the motion that we give Pete a \$200.00 gift certificate from Hometown Giving; Myra Elias seconded the motion. Motion passed. Pastor Dinah will purchase the gift certificate, and Myra will write the thank you note. The meeting was adjourned at 4:06 pm.
