From the Technology Department

Technology is a wonderful thing to help people stay connected with one another. It can, however, be a source of frustration when trying to join your favorite church service online. To minimize frustration when "the internet" is not cooperating here are a couple of things to remember...

- The Sunday service is recorded and is available on the church's Facebook page after the live service to watch when you have a better connection. It can be a day or two before it gets to the webpage at www.fccfrankfort.org.
- On occasion, the internet broadcast will just "freeze" or start "buffering" or sometimes just displays that annoying circle " ⊚ " going round and round while you wait patiently for the broadcast to continue. If that happens to you, try refreshing your connection by:
- Pausing the broadcast for a moment and then unpausing it
- Selecting the refresh symbol " @ " in the address bar OR
 pressing the control "ctrl" key and the letter "R" at the
 same time
- Closing the broadcast & Facebook and then reopening both again.
- Also, just understanding what could be causing it can be helpful, some possible causes are listed below:
 - ◆ The Church loses internet service on occasion (usually in the summer) due to the load on the network from all the visitors in the area.
 - You may lose service on your end for the same reason or that you are just in a remote area or weather interrupts service, etc.

Whatever the cause, patience is the best method to overcome or avoid frustration.

As always, know we are with you, and we appreciate you being with us!




Yahtzee & Euchre: Shaking Our Fists at January
