FCCF COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 8, 2021

The Minutes from the November 10, 2021 meeting were reviewed. With no corrections noted, the Minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Rob Burch	
Offerings for November totaled:	\$10,042.57
Expenses November totaled:	10,433.61
YTD Carryover:	9,534.66

Rob reports that the Budget is in very good shape at this time and following review was accepted as presented.

Committee Reports

Memorials: Judy Welch – There was one donation in memory of Pat Kinske.

Finance: Judy Welch - See Treasurer's Report

Investment: Chris Porter – The total of all Baird Accounts, as of November 30, is \$861,556.10.

Nominating: Myra Elias – See Unfinished Business

Outreach: Myra Elias for Kelly Ottinger –1) The Holiday Cookie Sale was very successful with proceeds totaling \$1,182.00. 2) A coffee fellowship time for Jim Petteys is being planned following his first service on January 2. 3) A new mask banner and a new Christmas Eve banner have been ordered. 4) Upcoming Al's Academy dates for 2022 are January 20, February 17 and March 17. 5) "Coffee Without Dinah" on Zoom will happen after the first of the year with Judy Grant facilitating; and 6) Calls will continue to those members/friends who cannot attend church services or are otherwise home bound.

Personnel: Myra Elias – Christmas bonuses; see New Business

Property: Myra Elias – Parsonage renovations during Pastor Dinah's Sabbatical will begin in January, pending the Congregation's approval. Myra has obtained bids for the repairs as described in our Council Report for the members to review. The Property Committee is requesting \$50,000.00 to cover all expenses. Following discussion of the financing of these projects and the urgency to get the projects started at the first of the year, Linda Schweyer made the motion that a special meeting of the Congregation be held on December 26 for the purpose of approving up to \$50,000.00 for the Parsonage renovations to be withdrawn from the Unrestricted Baird Funds as requested by the Council; Judy Welch seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved.



Worship: Ann Osborn – 1) Upcoming events include: a virtual Christmas program featuring our children on December 19, Christmas Eve service on December 24, Rev. Jim Petteys' first day for pulpit fill on January 2 (Al Bryant will introduce), Sanctuary de-decorating on January 4, and Council Commissioning on January 30. 2) Jim will have office hours on Wednesdays from 10 am – 12 noon;

3) A substitute choir director is still TBD. 4) Head ushers are in place for all but three months in 2022.

Pastor's Report: Dinah Haag - Report submitted

Unfinished Business: a) Nominations for 2022 Council: One-year terms continue for the current Clerk, Financial Secretary, Asst. Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Asst. Treasurer, and Investment Representative. Bob King will finish Larry Neuhardt's term for one year, and new three-year terms will begin for Betty Webb, Sonia Duffy and Beth McNamara. A motion was made to approve the 2022 Council Slate by Chris Porter; Linda Schweyer seconded the motion. Motion unanimously passed. b) Budget approval: Bill Hirschfeld made a motion for Council to approve the Financial Committee's 2022 proposed General Budget but withdrew the motion due to questions and further discussion concerning Off-Budget items. Bill Hirschfeld re-instated the motion with an amendment his original motion to state that Council recommends the proposed 2022 General Budget be brought to the congregation at the Annual Meeting on January 23 for approval; Linda Schweyer seconded the motion. Motion unanimously passed.

c) Benzie Community Chorus Request for Space: In response to the Benzie Community Chorus' request for office space in one of the Church's Sunday School rooms, the motion was made by Chris Porter that Council approve this request along with the Letter of Agreement between the Chorus and the Church; Bill Hirschfeld seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved. d) Additional pay for Rev. Jim Petteys: Jim Petteys has agreed to come in to the Church office each Wednesday from 10am – 12 noon for any pastoral care needs during Pastor Dinah's Sabbatical. With this added to his pulpit fill each Sunday and following discussion on adequate pay, the motion was made by Myra Elias that the Church pay Jim \$250.00 a week out of the Sabbatical Account; Linda Schweyer seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved.

New Business: Christmas bonuses: Myra Elias made the motion that Christmas gifts/bonuses for the Church staff remain the same as 2020; Linda Schweyer seconded the motion. Motion unanimously passed.

No Reports: Constitution & By-Laws, Missions, Religious Education, Women's Fellowship.

Myra Elias, Council Chair, called for adjournment of the meeting at 5:50 pm.
