I'm so excited! Fifteen years ago, 2017 seemed like a really long time away. A year and a half ago, it still seemed like it was somewhere down the road. We are finally at our Sesquicentennial Year Celebration! And are we going to celebrate!

The biggest thing we will be doing is special dedication service on Sunday, July 23, following our regular worship in the morning and a catered picnic lunch. During that service we will dedicate a new historical marker in the front of the church, complete with special speakers and the premiere of our commissioned choir anthem.

There will be another special service on Sunday, June 11 in which we will dedicate a time-capsule during an Old-Time Revival Service, featuring the Four Man Fishing Tackle Choir Quartet and a potluck lunch. We will soon begin to collect articles for the time capsule that will show who we were and our ministry to Frankfort.

We will also celebrate some of the interesting artifacts about this church, many of which will be displayed on the dining room walls.

One of the big things around our church is the singing, so we will lift up that love with a monthly Fine Arts Series. Some of the highlights of the series is a cantata that will be performed by church members and friends, a concert by former organist, Christian Matjias, Associate Professor of Dance and Music at the University of Michigan. Our favorite professional musician twins, Cristin and Matt Hubbard will be doing a shared concert in August, and it will be a hot time in the old church that night. Fine Art Series Events for other months are

in progress, but rest assured, we will announce them well ahead-of-time.

Of course, we will continue with the wintertime series we call Al's Academy. Andy Mollema did the January Academy on the history of our church. February will focus on the churches in Benzie County, and the March Academy is still being arranged.

To help with the winter blues, we're doing something called Classic Comedy Cinema — comedy genre movies that are historic classics. Featured actors are easily recognized for their humor: The Marx Brothers and other zany, funny folks. And as usual, there is no charge for these events.

If you didn't get a commemorative calendar—of either sort—fear not! We still have some available. The large wall calendar calendars are still \$10 each. (But wait, there's more! If you purchase one calendar, we'll include another calendar—for free!) Okay, so they're \$5.00 each. And the commemorative Christmas ornaments are still available for \$5 and \$6 dollars.

Such a celebration is a once-in-a-lifetime event, so invite everyone you can think of to be a part of this historic year. It is an honor to continue the ministry of those original 23 members, and our presence at each and any worship service builds on the foundation they started.
