

And when Person X asks how Person Y is doing, I am almost always blessed in that it is an inquiry, not of gossip, but one of genuine concern and care.



Council Meeting Minutes

FCCF Council Meeting Minutes January 8, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 4:01 p.m. by Mary Ann Harness, Council Vice Chair, followed by the Opening Prayer.

Treasurer's Report: Andy Mollema

1. Offerings for Dec. totaled: \$17,256.49 2. Budgeted expenses for Dec. totaled: \$11,237.30 3. Carryover YTD: \$11,945.87

Committee Reports

<u>Memorials</u>: Judy Welch - there were no memorial contributions in December.

Finance: Judy Welch - See Treasurer's Report.

<u>Investment</u>: Andrea Frost - See Constitution & By-Laws Committee Report.

<u>Constitution & By-Laws</u>: Mary Ann Harness - a change as been made in the Investment Policy portion of the By-Laws; namely, that the Outreach Committee be combined with Religious Education. To reflect this, the Investment Policy proposes the amendment to the Investment By-Laws: All Funds withdrawn from the Investment Fund for use by the Property, Religious Education/Outreach and Mission Committees shall be used in the calendar year the disbursements were made. All unused funds shall be returned to the Investment Committee and deposited into the Investment Fund. Mary Ann asked that there be a motion for Council's approval for the above stated change. Judy Welch made the motion to approve; Paul Osborn seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Missions: Paul Osborn - This account remains fully funded.

Nominating: Myra Elias - all new Council members have accepted their nominations and will be welcomed at February's meeting, pending the approval of the congregation at the Annual Meeting.

<u>Outreach</u>: Andy Mollema - 1) A review of past events since the last Outreach meeting, including Bill's Bible Study on Daniel, the Community Thanksgiving Service, the Silver Tea and Bake Sale, and the Christmas Eve service with 150 worshippers attending. 2) Upcoming events include one more "Coffee's on Dinah" at Petals and Perks on January 28 and Al's Academy on Gangster History on January 30. 3) A welcome to Dennis and Chris Richards who transferred their membership from Benzonia Congregational Church. 4) The Christmas Eve banner arrived incomplete and will have to be reordered.

Personnel: Myra Elias - No report.

<u>Property</u>: Dinah Haag for Andrea Frost - The general yearly expenses, including snow removal, lawn care, fire extinguisher check, etc. will total nearly \$17,000 which will leave approximately \$635.00 left in the account. There is nothing crucial among the upcoming projects, as stated in the December Council Minutes, so no expenses are anticipated in the near future. There are other resources if any emergencies would arise; however, the future projects should be a primary consideration for completion down the road.

Religious Education: Bill Hirschfeld - No report.

<u>Women's Fellowship</u>: Kim Scripps - No report.

Worship: Ann Osborn - No report, but a reminder that the next Communion Sunday will be February 2.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Dinah Haag - Report submitted with two notations: 1) Pastor Dinah will be on vacation from January 12 to January 22, with Phil Deloria preaching and Rob Burch emceeing at the January 19 service; and 2) Pastor Dinah will begin the second half of the webinar series that began last fall; the series has given her a large amount of information thus far, and she is looking forward to the next series.

Unfinished Business:

1) Myra Elias, our Council Chair, will be out of town on January 26, therefore, Larry Neuhardt has graciously agreed to preside at the Annual Meeting. 2) There had been thought and discussion on changing the date of the church's fiscal year to begin on January 1, however, in double checking our By-Laws, this will not be necessary as it already states it does begin on January 1. 3) Regarding our two current sources for the Constitution & By-Laws and the Investment Policy, the wording/verbiage could be reviewed at some point for any changes or updates. 4) 2020 Budget: Following discussion, a motion was made by Paul Osborn and seconded by Mary Ann Harness for the Church Council to recommend changing the Investment Committee's proposal. The new proposal is to withdraw 5%, up to a ceiling of 6%, out of the Baird Account for the allotted expenditures. Motion passed.

New Business: None

Myra Elias, Council Chair, called for the meeting's adjournment at 5:10 pm.
