Have you ever looked at a sidewalk that you've walked over a gazillion times and one day out of the blue, discovered a crack with a weed growing out of it? It didn't spring up over night, but you see it as if it were brand new. Today, February 24, I heard a passage from the second chapter of Philippians as if for the first time. I know I've read it a hundred times before because Philippians is one of my favorite books of the Bible. And yet, there it was—in the New Living Translation Version.

Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from his love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate? <sup>2</sup>Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose.

<sup>3</sup> Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too. <sup>5</sup> You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had. Ph. 2:1-5

Philippians is the letter Paul wrote to the people in Philippi, encouraging them to keep on keeping on. But they may have well been words straight from Jesus' lips to us.


A recent Ministerial Association meeting found us discussing working with fractions and finding the lowest common denominator—the lowest number with a relationship to all the other numbers. The lowest common denominator for Christians is Christ's love and sacrifice.

So often people think of the season of Lent as a time of dreariness and/or feigned piety. It's a serious time, certainly. But it is also a time to explore the ramifications of belonging to Christ, what it means to work together with one mind and purpose and to take an interest in others.

One of the great parts of Lent is that we live in the 21st century, as people of the resurrection rather than people without hope. Lent is not the end of the story but the opportunity to stretch our faith in its practice, allowing for the maturation of faith that results in a confidence of discipleship that cannot be purchased or traded.

So don't run from what seems hard or disinteresting. You may be surprised by what grows up to bless you and untold numbers of others that see those virtues blossom in you.




