A Brief History of Gifting and Blessing

An Investment Fund, Committee and Policy was created at a Special Meeting of the Congregation on February 29, 2010. The initial Investment Committee was comprised of Jim Buzzell, Bob Conrad, Andrea Frost, Ron Phillips (chair), and the Church Treasurer (Chris Porter)

An original bequest from Joe and Ruth Deacon of \$481,851.68 was invested into the Frankfort State Savings Bank, then to a Raymond James Account. Five investment managers were considered, and Manitou Investments was chosen. The investment was changed to R.W. Baird of Traverse City in 2011. The account at that time was \$587,505.

The initial investment of \$585,000.00 on March 17, 2011 has produced the following resulting totals.

With the exception of 2017, each year the congregation voted to spend 5% of the investment funds. In 2017, it was voted to spend 10%. The current investment manager suggests that while our Investment policy allows us to spend up to 10% per year, 5%-6% is a manageable and sustainable amount. The gifts we have been able to bestow because of time



The Missions Committee has determined to make a change-up to the projects we support; taking on Water for Good.
