Committee Reports

Constitution and By-Laws, Finance and Stewardship. Nominating, Outreach, Personnel, Women's Fellowship, Historian: no reports

Investment: Denis Crosby - our Investment Fund is showing positive signs, with our balance being \$618,000.00 as of March 9. This total is up from the recent low of \$595,000.00.

Memorials: John McElduff - \$125.00 was given in February; \$67.00 was withdrawn for the purchase of memorial plaques.

Missions: Dinah Haag for Myra Elias: 1) Lauren Church and her family are hosting the Coffee Hour following services on March 16 to help raise funds for her mission trip to Guatemala this summer; 2) \$500.00 has been given to Lauren Church from the Religious Education fund for her mission trip to Guatemala.


