The History of Mother's Day

The origin of Mother's Day goes back to the era of ancient Greeks and Romans. Early Christians celebrated a Mother's Day of sorts during the festival on the fourth Sunday of Lent in honor of the Virgin Mary, the Mother of Christ. But the roots of Mother's Day history can also be traced to the UK where a Mothering Sunday was celebrated much before the festival saw the light of the day in U.S. The celebration of the festival as it is seen today is a recent phenomenon and is not even a hundred years old. The day came into existence thanks to the hard work of two pioneering women of their times, Julia Ward Howe and Anna Jarvis. Howe, the activist and writer famous for her composition "Battle Hymn of the Republic", first suggested the idea of an official celebration of Mother's Day in 1872. Anna Jarvis and her supporters, in honor of her own mother's request to honor all mothers, wrote letters to people in positions of power lobbying for the official declaration of the holiday. The hard work paid off. By 1911, Mother's Day was celebrated in almost every state in the Union and on May 8, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a Joint Resolution designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day. Today Mother's Day is celebrated across 46 countries.

The Parlor!

Council Notes

FCCF Council Meeting Minutes There were 12 members present at the April 13, 2016 Council Meeting

The meeting was called to order by Council Chair, Larry Neuhardt at 4 pm followed by the Opening Prayer.

The first presentation prior to Council business was given by Cameron Clark from Hometown Giving. Cameron gave members an overview of how Hometown Giving works: It is an online community supporting local businesses, charities, and nonprofits. Our church can be listed as one of the nonprofits if we decide to do this (see New Business).

The second presentation was the Annual Report of our Investment Fund given by David Appleford from RW Baird. The value of our Stocks at this time totals \$374,632.00/59.8%; the value of our Bonds totals \$251,605.00/40.2%. The Fund has made 5.14% over the 5 years we have had the account with Baird, and despite the downward spiral in 2015, things are looking good for the long term. Denis Crosby, Chair of the Investment Committee, commented on how pleased he and the Committee have been with their relationship with RW Baird.

The minutes from the March 9, 2016 meeting were then reviewed. With no corrections noted, the minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Larry Neuhardt for John McElduff

- 1. Offerings for the month of March totaled \$5,658.65.
- 2. Expenses for the month of February totaled \$8,464.37.
- 3. This shows a deficit of -\$2,805.72.
- 4. Total current balance of Church funds is: \$69,434.58.

Following a short discussion and explanation in the insurance section of the Line Item Expenses vs. Budget Report, the Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented.

Committee Reports

Constitution and By-Laws, Finance and Stewardship. Memorials, Missions, Nominating, Women's Fellowship, Worship: no reports.

Investment: Denis Crosby – see RW Baird report above.

<u>Outreach:</u> Dinah Haag for Judy Grant/Myra Elias — upcoming events include 1) Dinner and Al's Academy on Comedians on April 20; and 2) the Gathering hosted by Andrea Frost on May 6.

<u>Personnel:</u> Andy Mollema – the Committee is continuing the process of updating the job descriptions of our employees.

<u>Property</u>: Andrea Frost – 1) The lower level (former Red Room) should be completed hopefully by April 20; 2) No starting date for the bathrooms as Phil Wade needs to be contacted for cutting concrete for toilet relocation; 3) The handrail for the Parsonage porch needs to be put in place; and 4) The porch still needs a final coat of paint.

<u>Religious Education</u>: Dinah Haag for Candace Nostrandt—there is now an ample supply of Sunday School curriculum material.

<u>Historian</u>: Al Bryant – Andy Mollema and Al have been doing much work on compiling historical data for the upcoming Sesquicentennial; therefore, there will be a report from the Sesquicentennial Committee listed in the Council's Agenda beginning next month.

Pastor's Report: Dinah Haag - report submitted.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business: Discussion concerning the possibility of joining Hometown Giving Community and having the Church's name listed under the nonprofits section. Al Bryant made the motion that Council approve our joining; Judy Welch seconded the motion. Discussion continued on where/what account any contributions would go. Pastor Dinah will also check back with Cameron Clark on how the Church would follow up on any donations with a thank you message. Deciding the Council needs a bit more time and clarification, the vote to join Hometown Giving was defeated.


