

It's not a thing that will affect anyone's salvation, so it's a




rather small thing. But it's a hospitality thing and an outreach thing, allowing people to do what they can with all the ease possible.

The March 10 Meeting Minutes were reviewed; with no corrections noted, the Minutes were approved as presented.

<u>Missions</u>: Paul Osborn – This account remains fully

funded.

<u>Outreach</u>: Dinah Haag for Kelly Ottinger – 1) Virtual attendance for our Worship Services has reached more people than expected. Dinah explained how Constant Contact has kept track of those persons watching virtually for the past months. 2) The audio-visual system installation for continued online viewing is in progress. 3) The 4th of July hot dog sale will not take place this year due to Covid uncertainty.

Property: Dinah Haag for Myra Elias: 1) Sound Environments is the company which will be installing our new audio-visual system hopefully at the beginning of June. 2) New pul-Idown cellular shades have been installed in the dining room. 3) Three apple trees have been planted by Jim Buzzell between the Church and the Parsonage.

<u>Women's Fellowship</u>: Mary Reed - A donation of \$100.00 was made to the Frankfort High School graduating class for their overnight party.

Worship: Ann Osborn – 1) The numbers for Holy Week services were: 20 in person on Palm Sunday, 5 in person and 105 online for Maundy Thursday service, 10 in person and 109 online for Good Friday service, and 64 in person with 153 online for Easter Sunday service. 2) The Alleluia banner will continue to be displayed for the time being. 3) A donation will be made to the Baby Pantry in honor of Mother's Day and Father's Day. 4) Passing of the offering plates is still on hold. 5) There are no weddings scheduled until June. 6) Pentecost Sunday is May 23 and the next Communion Sunday is June 6.



Memorial Day

This holiday was created to honor the many American men and women who died in military service. This focus on those who made the ultimate sacrifice sets it

apart from Veterans' Day which honors all military veterans, living and dead.

Memorial Day is always commemorated in the U.S. on the last Monday in May. In Canada, Memorial Day is commemorated with Canada Day on July 1st each year.

Americans wear the symbolic red Poppy flower on Memorial Day to commemorate those military people who have died. The red color is not a symbol of blood, death or support for war, but instead, were the only flowers that grew in war-torn battlefields. In Canada, poppies are worn on Remembrance Day on November 11th. The sight of the red poppies inspired one Canadian soldier, Colonel John McCrae, to pen the poem, "In Flanders Fields" in May 1915. The poem moved two women, Anna E. Guerin of France and Moina Michael of Georgia to sell artificial poppies to benefit children left orphaned by the War, and by 1922, the poppy was adopted as the official memorial flower of the VFW. The Friday before Memorial Day was designated as Poppy Day.



Champion Hill Golf Course is planning the 27th Annual Northern Michigan Transplant Golf Outing on May 1, 2021. After taking a COVID break last year they are ready to get back to it! This event began after Brady Cole received a liver transplant a the University of Michigan Mott Children's Hospital in 1991. As a way to give back, Brady's parents (Jim Cole & Jeanne Hafer) established the outing to raise money to help subsidize the cost of transplant recipient participation in Camp Michitanki (Michigan Transplant Kids) summer camp. The golf outing has been held each year since 1993 (except for 2020) and has raised over \$100,000 for the camp.


