### In honor of Flag Day, June 14 **Folding of the Flag**

the veterans departing the ranks who gave a portion of their lives for the defense of the country to attain peace throughout the world.

The **4th fold** represents the weaker nature, for as American citizens trusting in God, it is to God we turn in times of peace as well as in time of war for God's divine guidance.

The **5th fold** is a tribute to the country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, 'Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong.'

The **6th fold** is for where people's hearts lie. It is with their heart that they pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all.

#### June is First Congregational Church's Usher Appreciation Month



#### Sharon Grajcar's Red Cabbage Recipe

2 T. oil 1 medium head of red cabbage 1 onion, chopped Sauté until cabbage is wilted. Add 2 T. water 2 apples, peeled and chopped Salt and pepper to taste. Cover in pot and cook on stove as low as possible for 25 minutes. Mix 3 T. sugar and 3 T. apple-cider vinegar. Pour into mixture, cooking for 5-6 more minutes. It is ready to serve, but it can also be transferred to crockpot, and kept warm or kept warm on the stove. It's good cold, warm or room-temp.
