Pastor's Page

Sunday, June 11, 2017 will be a day I hope few of us will easily

forget! For lack of a better title, I came up with a Barbershop Worship Service, because, well, we'll have a Barbershop Quartet leading our worship that day. The specific group is the Four Man Fishin' Tackle Choir, and their reputation as professional musicians and delightful entertainers precedeth them. Despite the fact that their Lead singer now lives in Brainard, MN, Tenor Mark Wilson, Baritone Tracy Ulrich and Bass Neil Nugent decided to brush up their gospel tunes and bring us God's message in ways we don't usually hear. But that's only part of the reason it will be a great day.

The second reason I think it will be a great day is because that during the service, we will dedicate a time capsule, but not just any time capsule. A good many capsules, made of indestructible materials, are built into a corner stone of a church. Our capsule is being crafted of wood, in the shape of a 3-4 foot by 12-16 inch square cabinet that will serve as a piece of furniture in the sanctuary. It will be available for weddings (as a unity candle or memory candle stand), for funerals (as a flower stand) or any other job we can assign it. But that's only part of the reason it will be a great day.

That's because, as a part of the service, we are asking you to bring something to add to the time capsule. What could someone, 100-150 years from now, possibly want to know about me? I'm glad you asked.

Here are some ideas: a family tree, a copy of your favorite cd or dvd, your business card (if you have one), a picture of your and/or

your family, an old cell phone (with charger, of course), a movie or concert stub, stamps, a handwritten note, a kid's Happy Meal box, some money, a watch, whatever you think would be cool to add to our collection. (Just remember that liquids or food items are probably not going to make it that long.)

If you have kids, ask them for something that they'd like to contribute, because we want the folks "down the road" to know that our kids are an important part of our church family, too. But that's only part of the reason it will be a great day.

The big reason I think June 11 will be a great day is not just that we will be looking at our past (faith), but we will be making a real, personal investment into our future (faith).

We may save money for the future, we may make a will or a living trust for "that time." But we may not think too much beyond children, grandchildren, greatgrandchildren, nieces or nephews. On June 11, we will be giving thought to generations beyond us, people we will never know, and bestowing them with an insight into how we were involved in continuing the ministry of this church family.

The greatness of that day will continue after the service at a potluck in the church dining room. Like the earliest Christians, we will "break bread" as we deepen our relationships with each other as members of God's family. If you and yours can possibly be a part of June 11, that would be awesome. If you and yours can be a part of any other day, that would be just as wonderful.

What a blessed bunch of people! Shalom.

There were 11 Council Members at the May 10, 2017 Council Meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 4:01 p.m. by Council Chair, Larry Neuhardt, followed by the Opening Prayer.

First in the order of business was a presentation by Ed Schindler of RW Baird on the status of our investment portfolio. Ed distributed charts to Council members for review and explanation; the Church's funds are in good shape. The balance is \$672,000.00, with 60% of our funds invested in stocks and 40% invested in bonds. We have withdrawn approximately \$132,000.00 since we first invested in March of 2011. Thank you to Ed for attending our meeting and giving us his report.
