FCCF COUNCIL MINUTES IUNE 8, 2022

Members present: Sonia Duffy, Bill Hirschfeld, Bob King, Jim MacKenzie, Beth McNamara, Ann Osborn, Mary Reed, Kris Richards, Linda Schweyer, Judy Welch and Pastor Dinah Haag.

Council Chair, Linda Schweyer, called the meeting to order at 4:04 p.m. followed by the Opening Prayer.

The Minutes from the May 11 meeting were reviewed and with no corrections noted, were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Rob Burch

Offerings for the month of May totaled: \$12,040.40 Budgeted expenses for May: 10,402.18 YTD Carryover: 3,970.03

All in all, the budget is in very good shape with Council to begin thinking about budgeting for 2023.

Committee Reports

<u>Memorials</u>: Judy Welch – a total of \$1,025.00 has been received in memory of Pat Hessler (Missions designation) and Dick Brown.

<u>Investment</u>: Chris Porter – the total in both Restricted and Unrestricted Baird Accounts is: \$684,929.11

<u>Outreach</u>: Dinah Haag for Kelly Ottinger -1) 4^{th} of July Hot Dog Sale is on with a few changes this year including the placement and order of food and condiments, the additions of flags/banners to direct the flow, and the request for donations rather than charging \$1.00 per item as in the past. 2) Someone is needed to be the "Hot Dog" in the parade. 3) Coffee Fellowship will be moved to the Parlor for the time being as there aren't as many people staying and it may have a cozier feel.

<u>Personnel</u>: Linda Schweyer – a replacement for Katherine, our church secretary, has been hired. We welcome Mary Ann Short who will be working from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m., three days a week.

No Report: By-Laws, Finance, Missions, Nominating, Religious Education, and Women's Fellowship

Property: Kris Richards – 1) Discussion about minor repair from Gil Franz regarding a kinked hose with the dehumidifier and the upstairs bathroom sink stopper at the parsonage. 2) Continued discussion on replacement of the double doors in the hallway leading to the church dining room. 3) The church mouse problem continues. 4) Crystal Water Works will install drip lines to the front and side planters at the Church. 5) Asphalt Solutions has been contacted for a bid and opinion on repair of the Parsonage driveway sinkhole. 6) The Committee is looking for someone to power wash and paint the Parsonage north porch. 7) Steve Crouch is to repair windows in Parsonage main level and winterizing the front door. 8) Discussion on repairs/replacement of the Sanctuary front and side doors. 9) The final Parsonage project, except for the expenses of projects stated above, totaled \$32,295.11.

Worship: Ann Osborn – 1) The new Easter banner for the Sanctuary received good reviews. 2) The carnation corsages, courtesy of Linda and David Schweyer, made by our Sunday School children, was a lovely addition to Mother's Day service. 3) Upcoming events include: Celebration of Life for Beverly Augustine at Crystal Lake Cemetery on June 10; Father's Day and Maples Worship on June 19th; and Pastor Dinah's vacation from July 21 – August 5 (pulpit fill is scheduled for July 31 but someone is still needed for July 24).

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Dinah Haag – Report submitted, with several issues of note: 1) The Operation Christmas Child/Samaritan's Purse issue has been resolved. 2) The 2021 Missions monies have also been resolved. 3) The Finance Committee decided to stop using Vanco, the electronic giving company, and may look into Square. 4) Motion made by Bill Hirschfeld that Council allow Pastor Dinah to receive the \$3,350.00 that was left in the Sabbatical Funds. Kris Richards seconded the motion. Motion unanimously passed.




