## FCCF COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES JULY 14, 2021

Members present: Rob Burch, Myra Elias, Bill Hirschfeld, Jim MacKenzie, Larry Neuhardt, Ann Osborn, Paul Osborn, Chris Porter, Mary Reed, Kris Richards, Linda Schweyer and Pastor Dinah Haag.

Myra Elias, Council Chair, called the meeting to order at 4:05 pm followed by the Opening Prayer.

The Minutes of the June 9 meeting were reviewed. With no corrections noted, the Minutes were approved as presented.

The Budget is in good shape with a couple of timing issues in expenses. Discussion and explanation followed: 1) Could the Personnel Committee meet to discuss the Choir Director position since nothing has been spent thus far in 2021; 2) Baird checking account service charge and how to avoid this charge in the future – so that we do not have this charge again, a motion was made by Rob Burch and seconded by Chris Porter that \$2,000.00 be moved from the unmanaged portion of our Baird Investment Account to the Baird checking account; the motion unanimously passed; and 3) the Outreach Committee's budget is almost out so Pastor Dinah will do a double check and monitor this account for any future expenditures. The Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented.
