Giving someone \$50,000 in single dollar bills is not helpful unless you also give them a bag to carry it in. Giving someone a rowboat isn't helpful unless there are oars that go with it.

Sometimes, in the desire to be helpful, we can give advice that isn't desired. If the recipient of such unsolicited advice should let you know, it can sting. But it can also remind us that we all get to make our own mistakes. Discounting someone's feelings when something bad happens can undermine a person's confidence.

What is helpful when donating to a food pantry? Pop-top cans are more helpful than regular ones requiring a can opener, although when there's a will there's a way. Hamburger Helper without hamburger isn't as helpful as it could be with the burger. Peanut butter and jelly without bread isn't helpful. And it seems that everyone loves Stove Top Stuffing, but it's helpful to remember that requires chicken broth.
