Looking at the exterior windows of the sanctuary, unless one paid closer attention, they would seem rather innocuous. Upon closer inspection, as in the photo on the lower left, the greying aluminum, missing quarter round framing and the need for paint is/was obvious. The investigation to new sanctuary storm windows began sometime after the new year of 2020, and it was finished Wednesday, October 2 of 2021. A large part of the wait was for the materials of this custom fabrication, and like so many others, the materials were caught up in the chaos of Covid-19.

Another reason for the length of wait time was because of the stained glass window requirement, which is the need to breathe. So like humans, the lead in the windows have to allow heat to escape, even in winter. Little, tiny brass screens were inserted into the framework.

The windows—storms and stained glass—are well protected for the next many years, thanks to the generous bequests that have been put to work for us that we can continue giving God the glory for the honor to call this place home.
