"As our hearts yield to the spirit of Christmas, may we discover that it is Thy Holy Spirit who comes – not a sentiment, but a power – to remind us of the only way by which there may be peace on earth and good will among men. 

FCCF is once again participating with other churches for the **Benzie Senior Resources Christmas Project** of delivering gifts to those


who receive Meals on Wheels. We've been asked to contribute fleece lap blankets and toilet tissue.

<u>Missions</u>: Andy Mollema - this account remains fully funded

<u>Nominating</u>: Myra Elias - Paul Osborn and Kim Scripps have agreed to fill the two new vacancies beginning in February, 2019.

<u>Outreach</u>: Dinah Haag for Judy Grant: 1) The children's movie our church has sponsored on the Saturday of Thanksgiving weekend will be changed this year to the last Saturday in December; 2) Coming events include the Community Thanksgiving Service at St. Ann's on November 20, Cookie Decorating and Dinner on November 29, and the Silver Tea on December 1; and 3) Proceeds from the Fall Festival Cake Walk totaled \$229.00 and will be given to the Chamber of Commerce.

<u>*Personnel*</u>: Myra Elias - The Committee met to discuss proposed changes to 2019 salary and benefits for our administrative assistant.

The Nativity set on the altar this year is a combination of two sets that have been in my family for years. The manger itself was brought to this country over 125 years ago from Oberammergau Bavaria Germany where they have been putting on the Passion Play for 380 years. It was first performed in 1634 as the result of a plea made by the inhabitants that if God would spare them from the Bubonic plague, they would put on the play every ten years. The original figures were made of papermache and did not survive. The present figures were sculpted by hand by an artist that I met when we lived in Washington DC. They are a bit different than the usual representations. They are made out of clay and consist of Mary, Joseph, Jesus, the three kings a camel, a donkey, a cow, the innkeeper, his wife and the shepherd & his wife as well as several sheep & a cat & a dog.
