

The following Christmas prayer was delivered by U.S. Senate Chaplain Peter Marshall on Dec. 19, 1947, in the U.S. Senate, addressed to a victorious nation recovering from World War II.





There were 14 Council members at the November 11, 2015 Council meeting. <b>Treasurer's Report:</b> John McElduff   Income for October: \$7,298.06   Expenses for October: \$10,467.01   Total Current Balance of Church funds, as of October 31. \$71,470.08 <b>Missions:</b> Bob King All of our Mission commitments continue to be funded 100%. <b>Nominating:</b> Larry Neuhardt All but one Council member will return to serve a second term; 2) The Treasurer's and Assistant Treasurer's positions for 2016 will need to be filled. There are no candidates for Treasurer at this time and one possible candidate for Assistant Treasurer. The Nominating Committee explored the idea of outsourcing part of the Treasurer position and brought this idea to the Council. An initial motion was made by B. King that the Committee look into this. A. Frost seconded the motion. Before the vote, however, there was further discussion. It was noted that a bookkeeper could do the more difficult aspects of the job while the payroll and bill paying could be done by our Treasurer. The amended motion was made by B. King that L. Neuhardt proceed with contacting potential prospects for the job and get back to the Council with the results; A. Frost seconded the motion.
