The 1887 FCCF Sunday School Quilt

Few, if any of us living today would remember a quilt created in 1887, but one day last month, it walked into the Pastor's Office. Actually, it came into verbal being through the owner, Ruth Sasaki. Ruth and her husband, Dennis, were on a crosscountry trip back to their home in California and wanted to stop in Frankfort, the home of a great-grandmother. Seeing our church, they stopped in to tell some of their story, including that of the quilt.

Ruth sent the quilt to the Benzie Museum, where they can better care for it, after she took some photos and deciphered the names as best as she could. It's very fragile, with some damage from mice around the edges, but it's amazing that it's lasted 130 years; the last several years in a plastic bag in a shed.

Ruth so very graciously sent the 70 pages of notes to FCCF when she shipped the quilt to Benzonia. To give everyone the best shot at viewing the quilt, the information and pictures have been posted on our website, www.fccfrankfort.org. Click on the far right tab, Our History and Other Things and scroll down to Historic This and That, and you will find the story and names.

But to get you started, Ruth Merchant Sasaki is the great-granddaughter of Aggie (Agnes) Shine and J.H. (John Henry) Durkee. They had two daughters, Leola and Irma. Aggie and her sister, Maggie (Margaret) taught Sunday School here at the church.


The quilt then traveled with the family from Frankfort to Kalkaska to Tacoma, WA, Kellogg, MN, Pleasant Hill, CA before it was sent to Benzonia.

Both of Ruth's great-grandparents were born in Ontario, Canada. J.H. was a baker and was thought to have a confectionary in Frankfort.

Through the generosity of a lady I never knew existed, some of our forefathers and mothers have come to life in a way that may have been lost along the way. But just as God allowed this quilt to be a glimpse into our history, so may we continue to endeavor to stitch ourselves into the square of this

church's part in the greater quilt of life.

- Pat Kinske for helping with some choir folders. Even counting music can be of great assistance around here!




