

By a simple roll of the dice, or a draw of name, ol' Zechariah was high priest of the day, and all the other priests were outside of the temple, praying. He was doing his thing, making offerings to God, burning incense, praying, and all the other stuff that high priests do when it's "their day."

And then, out of the blue, an angel shows up, "appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard." (Lk 1:11-13a)

Mary probably didn't envision being the mother of THE Christ when she heard she was pregnant. But she probably wouldn't have changed a thing in the end.

God with us—a baby—long, long ago—coming to us—in a few short weeks. Keep on hoping, people. Christmas is coming.

FCCF COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 11, 2020

The meeting was called to order by Council Chair, Myra Elias, at 4:02 pm, followed by the Opening Prayer.

The Minutes from the October 14 meeting were reviewed. With no corrections noted, the Minutes were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report: Rob Burch

Offerings for October: \$6,277.00 Budgeted expenses October: \$9,930.13 YTD Carryover: \$-10,754.57

Rob reported that our 2020 Budget is in good shape and he will be working with Chris Anthony, our bookkeeper, to make sure the Pohlman Funds are shown in the Profit and Loss Statement. In addition, Rob asked the Council if he could contact Accountant Amy Plumstead to ensure that the Pohlman Funds are in compliance with the General Acceptred Accounting Practices (GAAP). A motion was unanimously approved.

There will be discussions for the 2021 Budget, with many unknowns to be considered because of the pandemic. Following questions and explanations, the Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented.

Finance: Judy Welch – See Treasurer's Report.

Investment: Ann Osborn – A of November 11, Stocks: \$420,497.63; Bonds: \$273,850.70; Pohlman Fund: \$127,100.11; the total in the Baird Investment Fund: \$821,448.43.

<u>Constitution & By-Laws</u>: Jim MacKenzie – The Committee has settled on the adjustments to be made and will bring them to the Council at December's meeting.

Missions: Paul Osborn – account remains fully funded.

Nominating: Myra Elias – The Committee is in the process of nominating people to fill positions for next year's Council.

<u>Outreach</u>: Kelly Ottinger – 1) The Halloween candy dispensing went well, and the kids seemed to have fun. Leftover candy will go to BACN. 2) Advent devotionals will be sent out this year. 3) Discussion continues on an alternative to the annual Silver Tea. 4) Benzie Senior Resources donations are still being taken until December 7th . 5) The Outreach Committee is changing their meeting dates to the first Tuesday of the month at 4:00 p.m.


